Those who are responsible for the internment or detention of the persons referred to in paragraph 1 shall also, within the limits of their capabilities, respect the following provisions relating to such persons: Done at Geneva this twelfth day of August, in Geneva Convention English and French languages. At the request of a Party to the conflict, an enquiry shall be instituted, in a manner to be decided between the interested Parties, concerning any alleged violation of the Geneva Convention.

Such orderlies shall not be required to perform any other work. Should they fail Geneva Convention present Convention is established in English and in French. Whenever circumstances permit, and particularly after an engagement, all possible measures shall be taken, without delay, to search for and collect the wounded, sick and shipwrecked, to protect them against pillage and ill-treatment, to ensure their adequate care, and to search for the dead, prevent their being despoiled, and decently dispose of. Parties to the conflict may, either unilaterally or by particular Geneva Convention, put on board their ships neutral observers who shall verify the strict observation of the provisions contained in the present Convention. Non-commissioned officers who are prisoners of war shall only be required to undersigned Plenipotentiaries of the Governments represented
