Magnesium sulfate may be effective in children with a more severe asthma attack
bronchodilators delivered by a pMDI result in a shorter stay in the emergency department and less adverse effects
tachycardia, palpitation, tremor, and hypokalemia than

bronchodilators delivered by nebulizers. Thanks to their anti-inflammatory action, corticosteroids are widely used to treat respiratory diseases in pediatric practice.
